What is this Reform all about?

- A Reform to strengthen the Voluntary Sector so that present and future voluntary needs in Malta are addressed
- A Reform so that the Voluntary Sector continues to be recognised as an important socio-economic pillar in society and eliminate the narrative of amateurism
- A Reform so that the Sector has all the strength and tools it needs to function as it should
- A needed change in process that goes beyond legislative change which looks at the Sector in a collective manner.

Who was consulted in the preparation of this public consultation document?

- The launch, which was held on Saturday 4th December 2021 at the President's Palace, was held under the patronage of the President of Malta H.E. George Vella – VO Plus convention
- Over 1,300 meetings with organisations
- Meetings with various other regulators in Malta
- 2 research projects with the University of Malta
 - Online questionnaire and
 - semi-structured focus group interviews.

- VO Plus
- Cabinet Memo of 20 June 2022
- Government Electoral Measures
 - The Concepts of One-Stop-Shop / Interregulatory Liaison with other regulators
 - Review of all organisations that have been revised in terms of format, scope and their operations
 - Restructuring of the Office.

What will change with this Reform?

- Role of the Office so that it becomes the Office of the Commissioner for the Voluntary and Not For Profit Sector
- Classification and Categorisation of organisations

- Status

Public Purpose and Public Benefit Organisation (NP-Org) or Public Purpose Private Benefit Organisation (PR-Org) - PR Org

- Structure

Association/Foundation/Trust/Federation/Platform

- Class

Philanthropic; Professional Association, Federation or Platform; NGO / Advocacy; Voluntary; Service Provider; Corporate Foundation

- Category (ESG based)

Social Interest; Environmental Interest; Governance and Policy Interest; Faith-based Organisations; Sport.

Change in Process

- Every organisation must submit an intent which is evaluated in terms of purpose, risk, the socio-economic impact, and key to this, a coordinated inter-regulatory framework
- Organisations with a public purpose (public interest) will qualify for enrolment, while organisations with a public purpose (private interest) will be categorised through a notification process that will be mandatory
- More adequate Reporting Procedures and a more efficient One-Stop-Shop concept.

What does the Implementation Plan involve:

- Strong legislative framework
- Reduction in Bureaucracy
- Greater development of the Office and services
- A more comprehensive and adequate sector
- More adequate criteria
- More awareness of the sector
